The candidate must demonstrate the ability to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including evidence of the ability to:

• assess individual arts and health requirements of at least three different participants, each participant presenting with different needs.

Knowledge Evidence

The candidate must be able to demonstrate knowledge to complete the tasks outlined in the elements, performance criteria and foundation skills of this unit, including knowledge of:

- organisational and legislative requirements and codes of practice relating to own role in the arts and health industry, including:
 - workplace health and safety
 - undertaking arts and health assessments
 - privacy and confidentiality
- organisational policies and procedures relating to own role in the arts and health industry, including those relating to:
 - obtaining and recording participant's health history
 - reviewing participant understanding of information, including using suitable questioning techniques
 - recording and reporting procedures, including recording assessment observations
 - · completing referrals, including various levels of urgency and follow-up of participant
- key elements of comprehensive and accurate physical, social/emotional and mental health assessment, including questioning and observing participant's health status, issues and needs
- own roles and responsibilities in assessing participants' arts and health requirements, and limits of own ability and authority
- professional protocols applied when obtaining participant history, including:
 - actively promoting and strictly adhering to participant confidentiality

Assessment Conditions

Skills in this unit must be demonstrated in a workplace or simulated environment where the conditions are typical of those in a working environment in this industry.

This includes access to:

- participants to assess and associated profiles of their health history
- personnel with whom to interact in the course of the assessments described in the performance evidence, including participant family members and/or carers, community members, and other required health professionals.
