Performance Evidence

Evidence of the ability to:

- plan, coordinate and supervise sound recording operations on location for screen productions
- monitor sound recording on location in line with safety and production requirements
- liaise with performers, sound recordists and production team to achieve production requirements.

Note: If a specific volume or frequency is not stated, then evidence must be provided at least once.

Knowledge Evidence

To complete the unit requirements safely and effectively, the individual must:

- describe the information that is typically found in production documentation and work plans
- list and describe the common equipment, accessories and consumables required for recording sound on location
- explain the relevance of post-production requirements to sound recording
- explain the issues and challenges that typically arise when coordinating sound recording operations on location, and how to address them
- outline the safety considerations that relate to the supervision of sound recording on location.

Assessment Conditions

Assessment must be conducted in a safe environment where evidence gathered demonstrates consistent performance of typical activities experienced in creative arts industry environments. The assessment environment must include access to:

- sound equipment and accessories
- screen productions where dialogue and live sound effects are recorded
- relevant production documentation
- interaction with others.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational educational and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
