Performance Evidence

An individual demonstrating competency must satisfy all of the elements and performance criteria in this unit.

There must be evidence that the individual has coordinated the development of at least one regional plan and has:

- reviewed existing planning documents and sources of information to inform the plan
- identified natural resource management issues and potential solutions
- organised for the collection and analysis of data to inform planning and monitoring progress
- identified stakeholders to form discussion groups, and sought individual input to planning
- worked with stakeholders and technical advisers to develop goals and performance criteria
- developed a draft plan for widespread consultation and feedback
- finalised and submitted the regional plan.

Knowledge Evidence

An individual must be able to demonstrate the knowledge required to perform the tasks outlined in the elements and performance criteria of this unit. This includes knowledge of:

- broad geographic indicators, with particular emphasis on the region
- national, state and local policies, procedures and legislation applicable to regional planning
- regional and rural planning concepts from town planning, rural industry planning, and natural resource planning perspectives
- natural resource management and issues
- impact of government processes and industry activities in social and economic terms
- consultative techniques used in regional planning.

Assessment Conditions

Assessment of the skills in this unit of competency must take place under the following conditions:

- physical conditions:
 - a workplace setting or an environment that accurately represents workplace conditions
- resources, equipment and materials:
 - national, state and local policies, procedures and legislation applicable to regional planning
 - computer hardware and software
- relationships:
 - influential organisations, groups and people.

Assessors of this unit must satisfy the requirements for assessors in applicable vocational education and training legislation, frameworks and/or standards.
